

Texas SB 240: Compliance Required By September 1

The Texas Hospital Association found that 61% of Texas hospitals reported an increase in workplace violence severity over the last several years.

To combat this growing problem, Texas lawmakers passed legislation requiring healthcare facilities adopt comprehensive workplace violence prevention plans and mandates the reporting of workplace violence.

Texas SB 240 Requires Facilities to:

- **Stablish a workplace violence committee**
- Document and implement a workplace violence prevention policy and plan
- Provide workplace violence prevention education or staff training annually, at a minimum
- Enable accessible reporting and implement a system to track investigations and responses
- Provide immediate support to employees following an incident of workplace violence and protect from retaliation
- Review workplace violence prevention plans and policies annually and present results to governing body


